On Thursday, 3 March 2016 Queen Elizabeth was welcomed by Lister staff, students, members of the National Youth Orchestra and guests including Newham Mayor Sir Robin Wales and Broadcaster Sir Trevor McDonald, a Trustee of the Queen's Trust.

Accompanied by Head Teacher Anthony Wilson, Queen Elizabeth entered the school's Agora to a fanfare as the members of the audience and the musicians stood in respect.

The combined Lister and National Youth Orchestra performed Benjamin Britten's The Young Person's Guide to the Orchestra to the 1,350-strong audience, with the Queen in the front row. The Queen also listened to performances from DrumWorks and Lister singers and dancers.

The Queen spent the rest of her morning visiting classes at Lister and met representatives of other charities supported by The Queen's Trust including Teach First, Frontline, IntoUniversity and Carers Trust.
