A selection of year 10 boys attended the 4th Livery Showcase Event at the Barber-Surgeons' Hall on the 15th March as 29 Livery Companies of the City of London enthralled them with an impressive range of career opportunities in the trades, industries and professions they represent.

Apprentices, experienced craftsmen and professionals set out their stalls for an invited audience of over 450 students and their teachers from across London. The aim of the event was to give students an idea of the career paths and job opportunities there are without necessarily following the university route. Students had a chance to talk to apprentices, under graduates and post-graduates as well as those who are more senior in their trade or profession in an informal setting while having some fun in taking part in challenges, practical activities and competitions.

This event was organised by Livery Schools Link, a volunteer organisation supporting education. LSL puts on events for schools and offers volunteering opportunities for members of the City Livery Companies.

This was a dynamic and vibrant event aimed to signpost students to a broad range of career paths and job opportunities across many disciplines which appeals to students of all abilities and ambitions. Talking to people from the trades and professions in an informal atmosphere was a wonderful opportunity for students to broaden their employment horizons and raise their aspirations. Many of the stands were interactive and ensured that young representatives and apprentices were available to talk to students.

Congratulations to former student Shilow Tracey who has secured a two year deal to play for Tottenham Hotspur. Having left school in 2014 he joined the National League South team, Ebbsfleet United's Football Academy.

Shilow made one senior appearance for them in a Kent Senior Cup tie against Charlton Athletic in September 2014. He also played a key role in their FA Youth Cup run, where they won through five rounds starting at the preliminary rounds. They eventually lost to AFC Wimbledon in the second round proper.



Shilow was invited to travel with the Tottenham Academy side to the IMG Cup in Florida in December 2015, where he scored twice in three appearances impressing the coaching staff. He was offered a permanent place in the Academy squad in January 2016.
