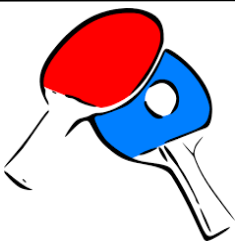

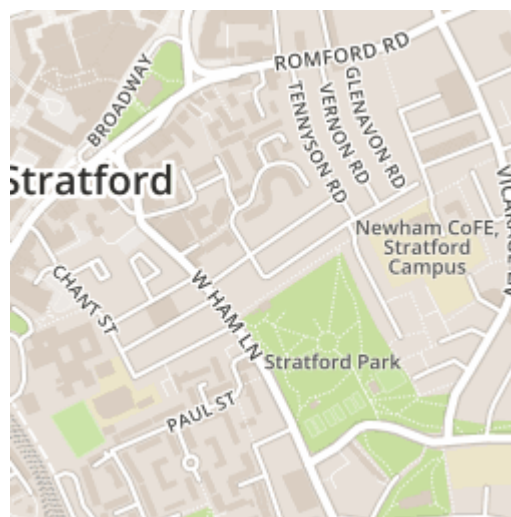


NEW TENNIS COURTS!
