Grades are given by class teachers and used to track progress. For all subjects grading is based on numbers 9-1, with 9 being the highest and 1 the lowest. Number grades are followed by a letter (e.g. 4H, 4M, 4L, 3H etc.), with H being High, M being Middle and L being Low. A 'W' means working towards grade 1.

Current Number Grade

This is the grade your son is currently working at.

Minimum Target Grade

This is the grade your son should expect to achieve in each of his subjects at the end of Key Stage 4.

Aspirational Target Grade

This is the grade your son should aim to achieve in each of his subjects at the end of Key Stage 4.

Effort, Behaviour and Homework Level

These are assessed as follows:

1 = Outstanding; 2 = Good; 3 = Satisfactory; 4 = Improvement needed.
