Understanding Your Son's Achievement Card

Grades and levels are given by class teachers and used to track progress.

Mock Grade

This is the grade your son achieved in his Y10 Summer Term/Mock exams.

Current Grade

This is the grade your son is currently working at.

Minimum Expected Grade

This is the grade your son should expect to achieve in his GCSE/BTEC exams at the end of Key Stage 4.

Aspirational Target Grade

This is the grade your son should aim to achieve in his GCSE/BTEC exams at the end of Key Stage 4.

GCSE subjects are graded under a new grading system of 9-1, with 9 being the highest and 1 the lowest. Number grades are followed by a letter (e.g. 4H, 4M, 4L, 3H etc.), with H being High, M being Middle and L being Low. A 'W' means working towards grade 1.

Some GCSE subjects remain on the A*-G grading system, with 'A*' being the highest and 'G' the lowest. Where the grade is followed by a number (A1, A2, A3, B1 etc.) it means 1 being secure and moving towards the next grade, 2 secure at this grade, 3 not being secure at this grade.

BTEC PE is awarded with the highest achievement being D* - Distinction plus, D - Distinction, M - Merit, P - Pass, I – Incomplete and F- Fail, being the lowest grade awarded.

Level 1 Sport is graded 1-4, with 1 being the highest and 4 being the lowest.

Effort, Behaviour and Homework Level

These are assessed as follows:

1 = Outstanding; 2 = Good; 3 = Satisfactory; 4 = Improvement needed.
