Future Steps Week

At Rokeby we are committed to ensuring that all students receive and experience appropriate Careers Education, Information, Advice and Guidance. This helps students to make decisions and manage transitions as learners and workers, equipping them with the knowledge and skills they need to make informed choices. This year we introduced 'Future Steps' a week long programme in partnership with outside agencies, colleges, 6th form colleges, apprenticeship providers and universities.



Newcastle University

Newcastle University came into school to lead a session on university life, focusing on business courses. The boys also participated in workshops centred on business decisions and finance, experiencing a real life taste of the work required at university.



Kings College University

Students were given the opportunity to tour the site at Kings College on the Strand and had the privilege of talking to law graduates.



The City Centre Visit

A group of boys visited the City Centre in Bank to look at Urban Town planning and to find out about routes into this profession. Boys had a talk and Q&A session, drawing on a range of subjects from Art and Geography to Physics and Maths. The boys even had a go at planning a new building in the city centre and the photos highlight their presentation. We also viewed a spectacular model of a landscaped building and visited an ancient Roman amphitheatre to get a real sense of how London has developed over time!

The students were taken around the impressive campus and given an open question and answer session surrounding the STEM courses on offer.

Students from across Year 10 attended a maths focussed workshop at Deutsche bank. This workshop highlighted the importance of maths and the range of career options open to students in the City.

Students were impressed by the formal, luxurious surroundings at the bank and the working environment in the City. The workshop was very captivating, especially the trading game during which students were placed in teams representing investment banks tasked with making money in six rounds. The boys thoroughly enjoyed making money, it was evident that some boys could see themselves becoming investment bankers or working in this trade in the future. Another group of Year 10s travelled to London Bridge later in the week to attend a similar workshop but at BNP law firm.
